




# IMPORTS TO OHIO BY VALUE AND ORIGIN INCLUDING TOP 10 COMMODITIES








# EXPORTS FROM OHIO BY WEIGHT AND DESTINATIONS INCLUDING TOP 10 COMMODITIES








# OHIO FREIGHT FLOWS BY ORIGIN AND DESTINATION









#### FREIGHT DESTINATION STATE
